Mission statement

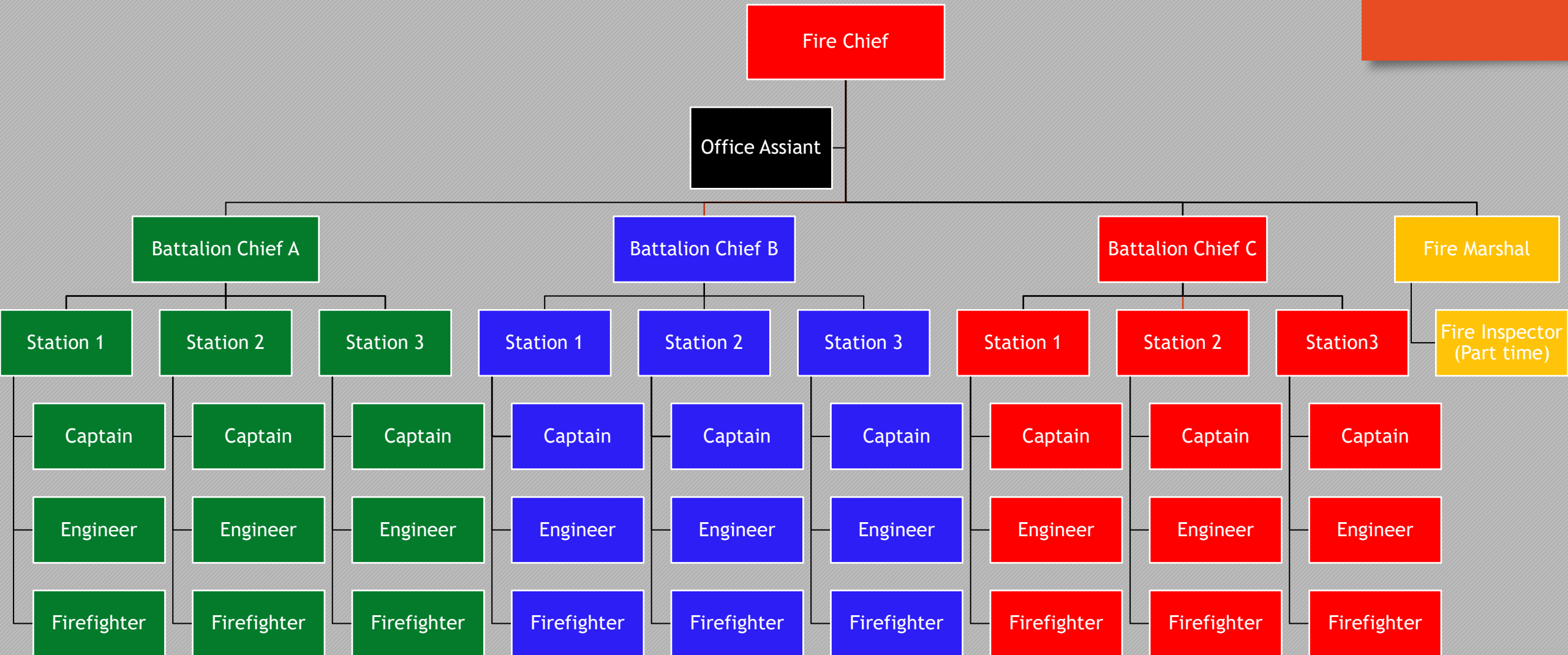
- “The Mission of the Hanford Fire Department is to deliver effective, professional fire prevention and emergency response.”

History of the Hanford Fire Service

- Volunteer Fire Department was organized after a fire destroyed 39 businesses in 1887
- In 1891 a second fire occurred destroying 15 businesses
- Hanford created a full time Fire Department and incorporated as a city in 1891 as a result of these historic fires

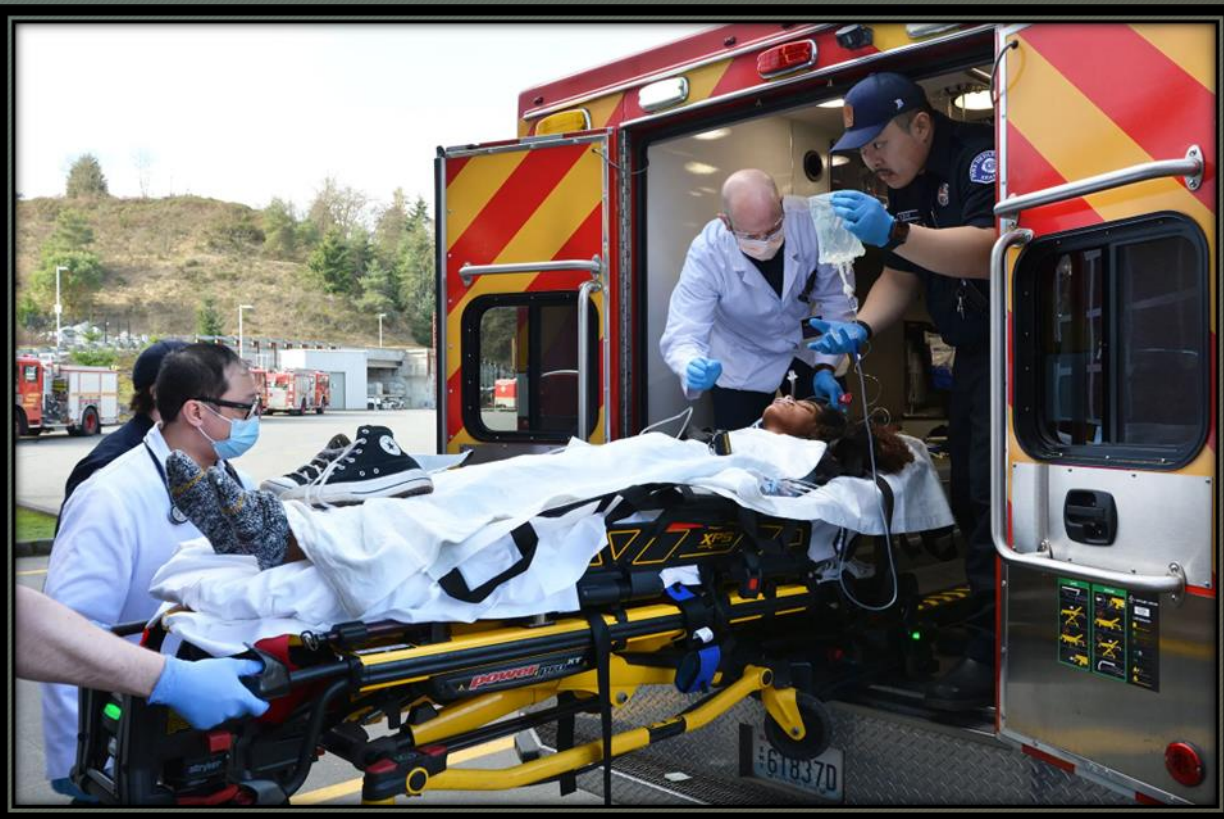

Fire Service Industry Standards - Response Times

- EMS Incidents -Response Time: 6 Minutes 19 Seconds
 - Irreversible brain death occurs after 5 Minutes with lack of oxygen
 - Goal is to arrive early to provide CPR and life saving measures
- Fire Incidents - Response Time: 6 Minutes 39 Seconds
 - A Fire can grow 16 times larger by 3 Minutes
 - Flashover occurs as quickly as 3 minutes
- Currently HFD is Not meeting Industry Standards:
 - 2020 = 59% 2021 = 60% 2022 = 63% 2023 = 66%

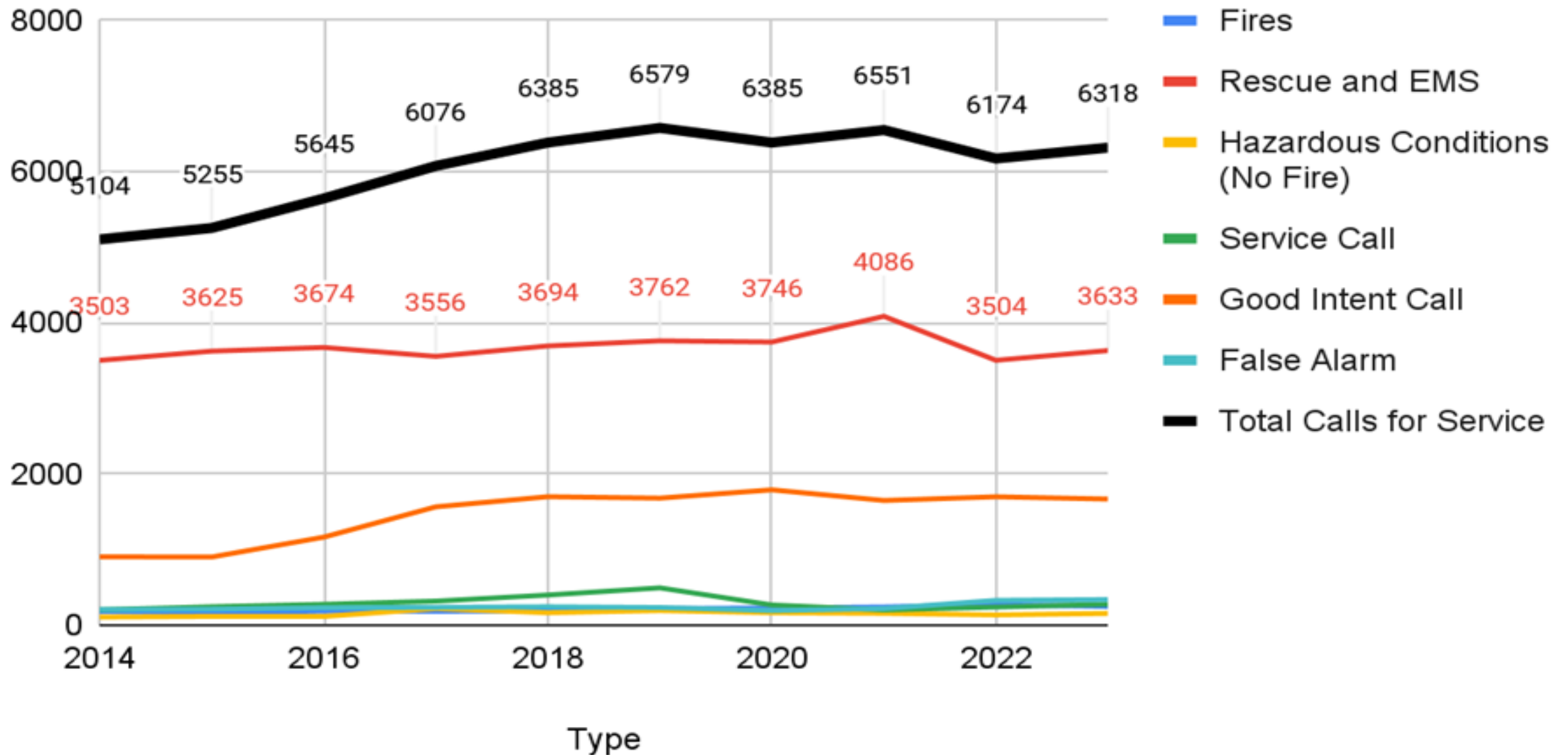

Effective Firefighting Force

- Hanford Fire Department Daily Staffing = 10 (9 FFs + 1 BC)
 - Structure Fires: 1st Alarm = 15 FFs
 - Hanford uses Auto & Mutual Aid from Kings County Fire
 - Auto Aid on Structure Fires: 2 Engines brings 5 FFs (E4 = 3 & E5 = 2)
 - KCFD Sta 4 is 10 Minutes Away
 - KCFD Sta 5 is 7-8 Minutes Away
- *According to PROJECT MAYDAY,*
 - *17,000 analyzed maydays, 71% involved resources staffed with 3 or less crew members*

Fire Stations

- Land has been purchased for 2 stations

Staffing for New Stations

- 9 New Personnel for each station

New Apparatus for each Station

- New Engine, New Ladder Truck

Need: Multi-Agency Training Facility

- Hanford Fire and Police
- Real Life Scenarios
- Live fire /rescue training



Firefighting Essentials

- Firefighters are expected to be skilled in fire suppression, vehicle extrication, medical response, and performing rescues, etc.



Need: Upgrade Communications

- Qty 50 Portable radios - Replace
- Qty 15 Mobile Radios - Replace
- Qty 3 Station Alerting System
- Primary/Secondary Repeater
- Firescope MACS-441
- New technology
- Target hazards



Fire Prevention Inspections



- 2,180 Annual Fire inspections with over 650 are state mandated (apartments, hotels, jails, schools.)
- Each inspection can range anywhere from 30 minutes to 3 hours depending on the size and type of the occupancy

Inspections continued...

- New construction includes underground water supply, sprinkler lines, alarm testing, and fire final inspection
- Hood inspections for restaurants
- Inspection of all above ground tanks
- Small and large family daycare inspections required by the state per year
- All these tasks are completed by the Fire Marshal and 1 part time inspector



Weed Abatement

- In 2023 the fire department sent out over 450 weed abatement letters
- Abated approximately 80 parcels
- 28 Fires related
- Over 600 hours spent on weed abatement





Plan Review

- Fire plans consists of reviewing fire alarm plans, access to and from the buildings, above ground tanks, road access and water supply
- Over 40 hours a month will be done on plan review totaling 480 hours a year, not including plan revisions
- Weekly Site Plan Review meetings normally last several hours

Fire Investigations

BY LAW...ALL FIRES MUST BE INVESTIGATED



- Over 270 fire investigations conducted in 2022
- All investigators are required 8 hours of training per year
- We currently have 4 certified investigators
- Investigators need a vehicle with tools and equipment





FIRE INVESTIGATORS STRIKE TEAM (FIST) Central Valley Arson Investigators round table 7

- Central Valley Arson investigators/CVAI is group that is made of arson investigators in the inland central valley from Fresno county, Tulare county, and Kings county fire department
- FIST is comprised of Tulare and Kings county Fire department arson investigators that will be called out for additional support when needed
